- Pencils – 2B: Mathematics, Visual Arts
- 2 x USB 16GB Flash Drive
- Colour Pencils
- Glue, scissors, eraser, sharpener with case
- Set of 4 highlighters
- 30cm ruler
- Pens – black, blue and red
- Students may wish to purchase their own safety glasses (will be provided with one pair initially)
- Old pillowcase to store projects in for Industrial Technology

Dear Parents/Carers,

Your child will be studying Technology Mandatory or TAS electives in 2024, which includes substantial practical work. This means working with materials and equipment that can be hazardous, if students are not wearing the correct protective equipment. For this reason, when purchasing new shoes over the school holidays, we would like you to purchase school shoes that meet the WHS requirements of the course and thereby reduce the risk of injury.

Students who are not wearing protective leather upper shoes in 2024 **will not** be permitted to do practical work. These students will be given alternative theory work.

My aim of this letter is to give you accurate and timely information about proper footwear. It is critical to note that canvas or partially canvas shoes and ballet-style flats are not acceptable.

Extract from current DEC policy *"It is mandatory that students carrying out practical activities using chemicals or equipment in schools wear enclosed leather footwear"*

The shoes below ARE suitable and meet WHS (OH&S) requirements at Maitland High School because;

- they have leather uppers,
- there are NO punched holes or mesh,
- they are NOT canvas, and
- they cover the upper part of the foot.

Some **suitable shoes** are shown below:

These shoes are **NOT** suitable as they are only partially suede and the rest of the fabric is canvas. The full leather style are acceptable
